Sherry Wolfe and Jack Kenney of Gran Tara HOA addressed the Board regarding monetary assistance in obtaining a storm siren in the Cleora area. The total amount needed being \$29,000.00, they have raised \$12,905.00 so far and have pledges of \$1,800.00 from various citizens and \$1,335.00 from REC and a promise of volunteer labor for setup. Robert Real, Emergency Management Director was on hand and offered to look into possible grants that may be available. The Commission commended Wolfe and Kenney on the diligent work for their Community and their role model for surrounding Communities. Commissioner Sanders addressed the Board regarding the need for commercial laundry facilities' and gun lockers to enhance security in the Sheriff Department. Commissioner Duncan announced there would be a Community Meeting for the public February 20 at Lake Eucha Fire Department

regarding County Government Education. He also asked the Board to get with the schools in their District regarding having assemblies on the importance of road signs and their effects given by LTAP. It has been addressed before in future courthouse renovation discussions and was decided it was needed at this time.
