AGENDA #5-A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Callihan to approve Hearing Human Resources Vici Cossairt on current status regarding families first Coronavirus. Roll Call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes Commissioner Callihan-yes Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried. Vicki Cossairt, HR Director, reported that there have been 3491 diagnosed cases of COVID up 348 from last week; 46 deaths increase of 2 from last week; 2885 recovered up by 231 from last week; 560 active cases which was up by 115 from last week. Since last reporting that is 60 more new cases than in comparison to 40 more recovered cases, which means cases are going up more quickly than recoverles are. The link to make appointments for getting vaccinations are on the State Website and also on the Delaware County Health Department Facebook page. Also, the 2-1-1 telephone number can be dialed for assistance with guidance on getting an appointment made. Clinic held last week in Grove successfully administered 150 vaccines an hour. DOT reporting indicated the potential to test positive on drug tests and to be aware of any creams and oils that may be used, some are not accurate in their indication of having no THC in them. Travis Beesley EM Director continues to spray the courthouse and we are all very thankful and appreciate his processes to keep everyone safe.

Mr. Beesley the EM Director offered clarification on the vaccination clinic held in Grove specifically that it was a County Sponsored clinic not City. The location was selected due to parking and the size of the building to more effectively facilitate a large number of vaccines. Following the clinic, they were evaluated and received an A+rating for a smooth process and flow of traffic. During the clinic they were organized and moved everyone through their vaccine very efficiently. It was noted in the evaluation in comparison to previous locations of other clinics held in Washington and Wagoner Counties were not as smoothly facilitated great job to everyone that helped. The arrival of 13 of the 20 Atomizers were received and Travis will be issuing them to each of the elected officials offices. He will continue to sanitize the common areas in the courthouse building as well as the Sheriff's Office, Library, and Election Board. He will order again since they are not durable but more of a temporary use item in case they break or stop working.
