Vicki Cossairt, HR Director, reported that there have been 4111 diagnosed cases of COVID up 161 from last week; 54 deaths no change from last week; 3763 recovered up by 219 from last week; 294 active cases which was down by 58 from last week. The numbers are trending slowly but in the right direction. Travis Beesley EM Director invited Marsha Moore with the Delaware County Health Department to attend today's meeting to answer questions and give updates on vaccines. 1. She is aware that citizens are having major issues with the

portal and being able to make appointments for their vaccine. 2. She made 350 calls personally over the weekend to assist citizens with being able to get their appointments made for vaccines, it has become her mission to assist the citizens of Delaware county to be safe and using all possible avenues available to do so. 3. Partners with the DHD are Grove Integris Hospital and Kansas, OK Pharmacy and are issuing vaccines daily. (Appointments are made thru DHD and then forwarded to the partner for the vaccine at that particular location) 4. It has been identified that approximately 50% of the vaccines administered during the PODs are non-residents of Delaware County. 5. Two PODS were scheduled this week one yesterday and one on Thursday being held at the Grove Community Center. (the schedule is for a longer timeframe to allow for parking logistics so not as many done in a smaller amount of time that the larger facilities allow for. The Civic Center was already booked by another organization and was unavailable. 6. Some discussion has been had in regards to the Community Center in Jay once the grass dries out for parking. 7. Discussion surrounding options for school faculty receiving their vaccines since they are in session during the day. Option I. a later scheduled POD Option II. A strike team to go into the school to administer Option III. A Passport Health team hold a POD specifically for the schools which is what they will probably utilize in conjunction with the Johnson and Johnson Vaccine which should be available in approximately two weeks. We are using all means necessary to make sure folks have access to vaccines and being creative in those methods to accomplish the goal of reaching all who want to be vaccinated. Thanks so much to Marsha and all the staff of the Delaware County Health Department to keep our county safe.

Further discussion has uncovered a possible grant that was applied for in the amount of \$20,000 (it is not currently known if it was completed and/or funds issued-Matt Rollins with OKEM to confirm details) Also, the Cherokee Tribe offered to pay any difference above the grant amount if needed by David Kendricks. The initiating EM Director at that time was in process of being terminated so during the transition it appears the process was left and not followed up on from any other offices and the vendor chose to move forward with the installation before acquiring the proper PO for the services.

Options available to proceed, according to District Attorney Kenny Wright are: #1 Venders are aware of the proper process for issuing and encumbering payment for their services during any fiscal year with the County and take the liability upon themselves when that process is not adhered to. #2 The previous responsible County Employee is held liable for that unpaid service since the proper encumbrance of funds and PO process was not followed. #3 Forward all documentation and communications to the DA's office regarding the failure to create an account and encumber funds appropriately from the authorizing employee and his office is then able to create a PO subject to funds availability to pay the outstanding invoice at that point.
