AGENDA #5-A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Callihan to approve Hearing Human Resources Vici Cossairt on current status regarding families first Coronavirus. Roll Call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes Commissioner Callihan-yes Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried. Vicki Cossairt, HR Director, reported that there have been 4429 diagnosed cases of COVID increased by 57 from last week; 62 deaths no increase from last week; 4231 recovered increased by 51 from last week; 133 active cases which is up by 6 from last week. Spring break is upon us and whenever there are large gatherings and traveling, a couple weeks after a holiday is normally when we see those surges. Let's remain cognizant to follow the guidelines. CDC finally came out with guidelines for those who are fully vaccinated (two weeks after their 2nd dose). New guidance from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control Monday for those who have been fully vaccinated against COVID-19, giving them some leeway to resume more "normal" activity even while the coronavirus is still widely circulating. CDC said individuals fully inoculated against COVID-19 can meet in small groups with other vaccinated people, in private settings such as homes, without wearing masks. Also fully vaccinated people can visit a single household of unvaccinated people without wearing masks if those not vaccinated are considered low-risk. Those fully vaccinated, however, should still wear masks when visiting unvaccinated people from multiple households. And they should continue with other precautions, such as avoiding medium- and large-sized in-person gatherings.

AGENDA #6-A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Callihan for approval to discuss and review the County's policies in relation to COVID-19 and take action to modify those policies as needed. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Callihan-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried. No changes continuing to proceed with all precautions, keeping social distancing in place and maintaining safety for citizens and personnel as the priority in the Courthouse Building.

AGENDA #7- A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Callihan for approval to discussion and take possible action for the Conveyance of real property located at 438 S 9th St, Jay, OK to the Delaware County Health Department. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Callihan-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried. Commissioner Poindexter indicated that there had been discussion for the Health Department to be able to move into the location and have a larger facility since the DHS department is consolidating and will leave that building available. Mr. James Thompson with the Health Department indicated proper research was performed to confirm the building as being a state-owned asset and how to allocate that resource to make the best use of the facility. The only expenses to occupy it would be the operational expenses such as utilities the same as their current location. In addition to them relocating to the new facility it would release their current facility to become available to the County as the Commissioners see fit to best utilize it. Neither building is encumbered, no bond issue as initially was a concern. Both are free and clear. Once the State Health Department takes ownership of the building the County Health Department would hire an architect and contractors to make the necessary improvements from their own budget that has those funds already allocated for the project.
