Vicki Cossairt, HR Director, reported that there have been 4687 diagnosed cases of COVID increased by 12 from last week; 94 deaths no increase from the last two weeks; 4570 recovered increased by 10 from last week; 23 active cases increase of 1 from last week. Very slowly and steadily trending in the right direction. Oklahoma color map moving from West to East changing from yellow to green. This is the second week following the Holiday and no spikes in numbers. Oklahoma is ranked 4nd in the nation for population that has been vaccinated. Pfizer has had 226 cases out of millions of vaccines that Pericarditis is one of the reportable side effects mostly in male adolescents and young adults age 16 years or older. In the news there was a Court Case regarding a Texas Hospital staff the filed against the hospital because they mandatorily were required to take the Covid vaccine and the Judge threw it out of court. Jeff Reeves EM Director indicated that Ottawa County has vaccinated less than 20% of their population according to their EMS Director. He will contact Marsha Moore of Delaware County Health Department for the percentage of citizens vaccinated here in our county.

AGENDA #15- A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter for approval of discussion with possible action for shared budget with the City of Jay for cleaning, repairs, equipment and replacement of tables/chairs for the Jay Community Center. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes and Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried. Mayor Becki Farley indicated approval from the City Council for two items: (1) To hire someone to deep clean the Community Center using funds from the recent rental monies collected. A citizen agreed to do the deep cleaning in the evening hours for approximately three evenings until completed for \$600 and put out for bid for a cleaning service for scheduled cleanings until employees are hired to manage and keep it clean (2) To open a checking account to manage the rental monies and the cleaning deposits to facilitate the Community Center rentals. Mayor's office currently holding a check waiting to deposit to an approved account. Per District Attorney he recommended the price for the cleaning was a bargain as well as the checking account opened the account in the City's Name until the final Interlocal Agreement could be settled upon between the attorneys is completed.

A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Kirk for approval of the City of Jay to open a checking account in their name for managing the deposits and rental fees for the Jay Community Center and having the Community Center cleaning done for \$600. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes and Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #16- A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter for approval of invoice in the amount of \$350.00 submitted by Craig County Detention Center for housing juvenile in May, 2021. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes and Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #19-A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter approval to open the floor for new business. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes and Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried. No new business.

AGENDA #20-A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter for approval to open the floor for public comments. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes and Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried. David Morris Delaware County Waste Director indicated they had their board meeting and nothing new just normal housekeeping discussion. The new hours of being closed on Tuesday instead of Sunday is working well once the citizens got used to it initially, they were receiving a lot of calls. Commissioner Poindexter indicated he heard feedback and all were pleased with the change. Waste has doubled since the Pandemic started. Observed an uptick in construction and remodels. Still working on the sites on the south end – no developments on their progress. Traded some services for dirt

work at the Little Kansas site. Working on a lease in West Siloam and hammering out the agreement and setline on a price and Colcord. Should have the 412-corridor locked down and then will focus on the Disney/Tijuana area probably take the next couple years getting sites prepped and opened. Looking land to purchase preferably. Will need to bid out some more trailers soon since we are all hands-on deck with 232 employees and summer is always busier also. As long as the increased sales tax keeps coming in everything looks good. Mike Major Q1. Would like to acknowledge how good the service is in regards to his area for Solid Waste. Q3. Also, for coming through audit with no errors. Q3 Suggestion for Solid Waste may qualify on Infrastructure for some of the American Rescue monies at least for health purposes. Q4. What is the ertl rate for calculating the Green and Yellow Covid levels in the state? The state website can answer that question specifically but it has to do with the population percentages of Covid cases, as the percentages go down the color moves down to a lower level.
