AGENDA #5 – A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Conley Chesney (designee) to approve Hearing Human Resources Vicki Cossairt on current status regarding families first. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Conley Chesney (Designee)-yes. Motion carried. Vicki Cossairt, HR Director, reported that there have been 7107 diagnosed cases of COVID increased by 99 from last week; 135 deaths increased by 9 from last week; 6817 recovered increased by 137 from last week; 155 active cases decreased by 47 from last week. The numbers are trending in the right direction. Please keep in mind we have Fall Break, Halloween, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas coming up, so if we want to make any changes in the courthouse protocols, please keep in mind we usually see spikes during and after holidays. On the news MERCK is seeking FDA approval for a pill that treats Covid which would be the first of its kind, a huge step in the right direction if that were to receive approval. Pfizer is still seeking FDA approval for vaccinations for children as young as age five (5). Please remember your annual Flu vaccine and any other annual vaccinations to make sure they are current. Dr. Fauci indicated on the news that he expects the Covid numbers to go down during the winter, hopefully that is correct.
