AGENDA #6 – A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Conley Chesney (designee) to approve Hearing Human Resources Vicki Cossairt on current status regarding families first. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Conley Chesney (Designee)-yes. Motion carried. Vicki Cossairt, HR Director, reported that there have been 7180 diagnosed cases of COVID increased by 73 from last week; 139 deaths increased by 4 from last week; 6915 recovered increased by 98 from last week; 139 active cases decrease of 16 from last week. Numbers are trending in the right direction slowly. Keep in mind we have some holidays coming up, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving, Halloween, Christmas and New Year's. Hopefully if we continue doing what we have the numbers will continue to trend in the right direction.

AGENDA #7- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Conley Chesney (designee) for approval to discuss and review the County's policies in relation to Covid-19 and take action to modify those policies as needed. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Conley Chesney (Designee)-yes. Motion carried. Commissioner Poindexter said there were not changes to be made as we are doing all that we can.

AGENDA #8- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Conley Chesney (designee) for approval of update provided by David Floyd of Floyd & Driver PLLC on current status and processes related to the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 and to field any questions from the Board of Commissioners. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Conley Chesney (Designee)-yes. Motion carried. David Floyd was present representing Floyd & Driver PLLC and thanked the Commissioners for the opportunity to bring his updates in person. Initially the update would have covered the information required for the Interim Report due at the end of October but Treasury changed the due date to the end of December and he will be back then for another update. Which allows for more time to confirm accuracy and qualifying treasury guidelines for applicants. The BOCC has approved and funded (3) Three recipients under the Non-Profit Resiliency Program so far. We are working well with county staff and wanted to pay a special compliment to Dena Tolle, she has been outstanding to work with and she has made my life very, very easy. You have excellent staff here which has put you miles ahead of the other counties I am working with. Things to look at going forward that are in the works, are Premium Pay proposals, sick pay and eligible essential workers and front-line staff. I will meet with each Commissioner individually to discuss the needs you have identified for the county. At this point we are in good shape you are far ahead of the curve. Most counties are just now beginning to assess their needs, you did that months ago so you are in very good shape. I am happy to answer any questions on the over all plan and how the process is going or any specifics. Commissioner Callihan inquired regarding other counties have they issued any funds yet. Mr. Floyd responded with yes but in a different category, in premium pay slightly less in dollar amount but not by much. Commissioner Poindexter inquired regarding what qualifies a frontline or essential employee? Mr. Floyd responded with the treasury guidelines that were clearly outlined with further clarification in July regarding those personnel. Commissioner Callihan also inquired if there were any newer guidelines since July? Response is no so far, but that may change. Commission Poindexter indicated now that the Non-Profit programs are off and running, he would like to move forward with the larger infrastructure programs namely the Rural Water districts as well as Broadband which will improve virtual business transactions with the higher speeds. He has visited with Bolt and there have been some limitations that will need to be addressed throughout the process to achieve the improved speeds. Mr. Floyd indicated that the Pandemic has revealed that high speed economical internet is now just as important as electricity for business, education and health. We want to work with other state and local organizations on joint projects, if possible, to achieve the improvements. District Attorney Kenny Wright indicated awareness of more formalized approval processes at other counties, for vetting beneficiaries. He indicated our process as being more informal, and what were Mr. Floyd's recommendations on that process? Mr. Floyd responded, that he has put together a metric system to make that a more formalized process. So going forward in conjunction the Firm providing guidance of approved purposes and a safe expenditure and then we will let you cross-reference that with BOCC stated goals. Commissioner Poindexter thanked him for the update and answering all their questions.

AGENDA #9- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Conley Chesney (designee) for approval of the first three recipients of the Non-Profit Resiliency Grant program for photos and personal thanks to the Board of Commissioners for the needed help they provided. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Conley Chesney (Designee)-yes. Motion carried. DCCSAN was represented by Director Jill McAbee, Historical Society (Mariee Wallace Museum) was represented by Mayor Becki Farley, and American Legion Post #195 was represented by Commander John Key, the photos were taken as each organization received the proceeds from the BOCC - Commissioner Poindexter (Chairman), Commissioner Callihan (Member) and Designee Chesney (Designee), they were the first grant recipients of the initial ARPA programs created, following their lengthy approval processes and qualifications that met the US Treasury Guidelines.

Bid #21-22/07. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Conley Chesney (Designee)-yes.

A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Callihan to accept the bid from Chief Fire & Safety with lease option for 163 months payment financing through the Bank of Grand Lake.

AGENDA #11- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Conley Chesney (designee) for approval of resolution for Grand Gateway to file and process a grant application on behalf of Hickory Grove Rural Fire Department for financial assistance from the Rural Economic Action Plan fund of \$39,812.50 for Building Upgrades to include: three (3) Bay Doors, two (2) restrooms repaired and improvements labor provided by firemen and their families, 50x80 asphalt patch replaced by concrete, showers installed (no showers for when chemicals are encountered on a call) and several areas with wall damages needing repairs. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihanyes; and Conley Chesney (Designee)-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #12- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Conley Chesney (designee) for approval of resolution for Grand Gateway to file and process a grant application on behalf of Cowskin Rural Fire Department to replace functionally obsolete AEDS with new more cost efficient AEDS programmed to current standards from the Rural Economic Action Plan fund of \$5,564.65. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Conley Chesney (Designee)-yes. Motion carried. The Chief was present to present additional details regarding the equipment and why they are opting to go with reconditioned equipment to save money and change the type of equipment so going forward they will be more cost effective for replacement batteries and repairs.

AGENDA #13- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Conley Chesney (designee) for approval of resolution for Grand Gateway to file and process a grant application on behalf of District #1 project located at the East end of Bernice Bridge on Hwy 85A to provide a walking trail, bike trail, entrance into recreation area and lockout towers. District #1 Commissioner will provide labor and equipment, from the Rural Economic Action Plan fund of \$25,000. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Conley Chesney (Designee)-yes. Motion carried. Rick Littlefield present to give specific details regarding the grant and the items it will include. District #1 will provide labor and equipment. One of the benefits is that even if the water levels are high the new areas will all still be accessible.
