

## DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES June 28, 2022

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 9:00 a.m. on June 28, 2022. The agenda was posted June 27, 2022 at 8:05 a.m. and placed in the kiosk located on the courthouse lawn as well as the county website. Members of the Board present were Commissioner David Poindexter-Chairman, Commissioner Jake Callihan-Member, Commissioner David Beck-Member and County Clerk Barbara Barnes -Secretary. AGENDA #5 was not needed as no monthly reports were submitted by officers. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #6 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck for approval of citizen's participation or comments. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Darren Hull who works for the City of Grove thanked Poindexter for the cooperative effort between District #1 and the City of Grove on a road and bridge project on Road 640. "It's good to work with each other," Hull said. "I hope we can do it again." Boothe said at several meetings she attended in conjunction with the City of Grove, the same appreciation was expressed.

Jeff Reeve, EM Director, said the commissioners are required to complete NIMS (National Incident Management System) certification training. He said four of the six courses can be taken online. He said there is an in-person training set up for September in Grove. "If we have an event, it will make things go much better," Reeves said.

AGENDA #7 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve report by Human Resources Vicki Cossairt. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Cossairt said Delaware County continues to have a low Covid rate. She said one seasonal grader operator has been hired for District #3. "We have a policy to allow employees to go vote on work time," Cossairt said. She said the policy can be provided for anyone who wishes to see it.

AGENDA #8- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve leases for fiscal year 2022-2023 for Delaware County Court Clerk's Office. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #9-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to receive and file officers for Delaware County Court Clerk's Office as follows: Requisitioning Officers – Karma Sapp, Chelsea Hicks, Caroline M. Weaver, Natasha Isaac and Veronica Stanley; Receiving Officers – Amber Moore, Jennifer Garcia, Ashlyn Andrews and Ashley Gutierrez; Inventory Officers – Caroline M. Weaver and Natasha Isaac. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #10-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to approve a resolution and choose payment option for ACCO-SIG property and liability coverage renewal in the amount of \$435,551.00 if paid in one payment, due July 31, 2022; a 15 percent increase from last year. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Poindexter told Sheriff Beck a lot of the reason for the increase is

paying out for sheriff's office judgments. Callihan said ACCO has repeatedly stated that law enforcement may have to be dropped from the self-insured program to keep it solvent. Sheriff Beck said no lawsuits have been filed since he has been sheriff and the only incidents with cars had been burning up which was not his office's fault and one collision which was not his officer's fault. Cossairt said if there is an employee who wrecks more than once that might be a problem to address. Beck said that should not happen with his employees as they are properly trained to drive. "If they wreck, they are going too fast," Beck said.

AGENDA #11-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to sign the project agreement between District #1 and Oklahoma Department of Transportation for a lake access road, Project #SAP-221D(062). Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #12-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to approve payment of May and June invoices for American Rescue Plan Act professional services from Floyd & Driver in the amount of \$15,189.08. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #13-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to approve a resolution authorizing and accepting a donation deposit for the Sheriff's Office in the amount of \$500 from Southwest City Missouri Commercial Club. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Sheriff Beck said his office was asked to handle traffic and peace keeping at the Southwest City rodeo. He said he took several officers there and took care of both. Later a check showed up as a thank you, Beck said, for the sheriff to use in whatever way he saw fit.

AGENDA #14-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck discuss with possible action payment of membership dues to Grand Gateway Economic Development Association in the amount of \$8,000. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #15-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action first amendment contract in the amount of \$14, 574.51 per month with Turnkey Health Clinics to provide medical staffing and administration in the Delaware County Jail. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. A discussion revealed this amount is wrong and was not the one quoted to the sheriff's office. An amended version of the contract arrived after the meeting agenda was filed with the correct amount, \$8222.20 per month. Poindexter made a motion to accept the amended contract at \$8,221.20 per month. Second was made by Callihan. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #16-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to table a warranty deed conveying Delaware County's undivided one-half interest in the Community Center/Library Property to the Town of Jay until July 5. Wright told the commissioners he had drafted a Memorandum of Understanding between the Town of Jay and the County and that should be executed before the deed was signed and filed. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #17-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to open the floor for new business. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. There was none.

AGENDA #18-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to adjourn at 9:28 a.m. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.
