

DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES

September 6, 2022

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 9:00 a.m. on September 6, 2022. The agenda was posted September 2, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. and placed in the kiosk located on the courthouse lawn as well as the county website. Members of the Board present were Commissioner David Poindexter-Chairman, Commissioner Jake Callihan-Member, Commissioner David Beck-Member and County Clerk Barbara Barnes -Secretary. The Board of Delaware County Commissioners is hereby authorized to act on the following items:

Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Beck-yes. Motion carried. Reports were presented by the Assessor, Sheriff, Health Department and County Clerk.

AGENDA #6 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck for approval of citizen's participation or comments. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Stacy Rose presented a statement concerning 344 Road and 539 Loop, which she identified as Shady Acres Road. She said Tracy Schuster, who spoke at a previous meeting, claimed the roads are private, but none of the other residents believe they are. Rose said she has lived in her home 23 years and no one has ever said a thing about the roads being private. Rose said the road past the Schuster property is steep and rough and if the county stops maintenance it will become dangerous. Rose said they roads have county road signs and the 1972 Shady Acres plat says the roads are dedicated to the county. Rose said there were private driveway easement documents filed in 1973 and 1974. Rose said two accredited engineers have reviewed the plats and documents and it is their opinion the roads belong to the county. Rose said property development cannot be stopped by discontinuing the road maintenance.

Scott Bowen said Tracy Schuster presented no documents to the commissioners to prove the road is private and "no one asked her" is not a reason to vacate a county road. Bowen said Schuster does not live on the property she owns. Bowen cited several book and page references in the county records to support the claim the roads are public. "I think documents carry more weight than a person saying they don't agree," Bowen said.

Megan Escalante said the roads should be public by prescription, since the county has been maintaining them for 50 years and these roads are the only access to these peoples' property.

AGENDA #7 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve report by Human Resources Vicki Cossairt. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Cossairt said three new employees have begun working in the county. There are 11 positions open county-wide, but she said two positions, for dispatch and deputy, are left open in perpetuity. She said people often ask her how many employees the

county has. Cossairt said there are 145 to 146 total employees if all the positions are filled. The county needs CDL drivers and Cossairt said new regulations make the license more difficult to acquire. The state is providing training for a barn employee who is already a CDL driver to become an instructor to help grow CDL certified drivers from current employees. She said Foreman Russell Martin from District 3 is already scheduled to attend the instructor training.

Cossairt said she and Payroll Clerk Tayla Douglas have virtual benefits training this week and next week and open enrollment for employee benefits will begin soon. Cossairt said as a result of a recently passed law, employees with a CDIB card may opt out of the insurance paid totally by the county and receive the \$100 stipend per pay period in lieu of county insurance.
