

DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES

DECEMBER 28, 2022

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 9:00 a.m. on December 28, 2022. The agenda was posted December 22, 2022 at 8:56 a.m. and placed on the courthouse door as well as the county website. Members of the Board present were Commissioner David Poindexter-Chairman, Commissioner Jake Callihan-Member, Commissioner David Beck-member. The Board of Delaware County Commissioners is hereby authorized to act on the following items:

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Poindexter followed by the flag salute and roll call. County Clerk Barbara Barnes was absent.

AGENDA #5 was not needed as no monthly reports were submitted by officers.

AGENDA #6 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck for approval of citizen's participation or comments. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. "What is the legal division for the bond issue excess sales tax funds?" Carolyn Boothe asked. Poindexter said there has been no decision on how to distribute those funds. Callihan said the commissioners received their first amount from the sales tax dedicated to roads (extension of the bond used to pay for the jail lawsuit). Poindexter said that amount is approximately \$216,000 divided by three.

AGENDA #7 was not needed as Human Resource Director Vicki Cossairt was on vacation.

AGENDA #8-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to open the floor for new business. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. There was none.

AGENDA #9 A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to sign affidavits for the December 30 payroll. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #10-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to select vendor for 911 Center equipment and approve payment from ARPA funds. Emergency Director Jeff Reeves said the 911 committee has been meeting for six months to research and decide the best system to purchase. He said the members were looking for type, availability and compatibility of radios. Reeves said the board concluded the Z Tron system will be best for Delaware County. Reeves said two proposals (not bids) have been received for the 911 system. He said both are good companies, but Stolz Telecom provided the only Z Tron proposal. Reeves said although the Stolz proposal is substantially higher than the one from Smith Communications, the board recommends choosing the Z Tron system. Reeves said both bidders are on state contract. Poindexter asked for copies of the proposals. Reeves said he would be happy to provide more copies, but the proposals were in the packet provided to the commissioners more than two weeks ago. The proposals were also provided to the commissioners at an earlier meeting. Callihan had his packet with him, but said he had not read it and would like to go over it with Reeves. Reeves said he would be happy to go over the figures with the commissioners.

Jay Fire Chief Brandon Alexander is on the 911 committee and said the members researched all the systems. Reeves said the other fire chiefs like this set up as well. Reeves said there are members on the committee from all parts of the county.

AGENDA #11-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve meeting dates for Delaware County Board of Commissioners meetings. Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Poindexter said the item will be put on the next agenda to give everyone time to review the material.

AGENDA #12-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to accept/reject lowest/best bid on a used motor grader on behalf of District #1. The sealed bids were opened December 13. County bid #22-23/16. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Poindexter said neither of the bids fit what he is looking for. Motion was made by Poindexter and seconded by Callihan to reject all bids. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #13-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to look at property listed on the county's insurance and made a schedule for taking appraiser to look at the property when he comes January 3, 2023. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #15-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to sign Memorandum of Understanding with the Cherokee Nation to clarify maintenance responsibilities for public roadways placed on the TTP Inventory. If the Cherokee Nation constructs any of the listed routes, the county becomes responsible for maintaining the roadway once the construction is completed. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #16-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to adjourn at 9:26 a.m. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.
