

DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES

March 14, 2023

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 9:00 a.m. on March 14, 2023. The agenda was posted March 13, 2023 at 8:48 a.m. and placed in the kiosk located on the courthouse lawn as well as the county website. Members of the Board present were Commissioner David Poindexter-Chairman, Commissioner Jake Callihan-Member, Commissioner David Beck-Member and County Clerk Barbara Barnes -Secretary. The Board of Delaware County Commissioners is hereby authorized to act on the following items:

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Poindexter followed by the flag salute and roll call. All members were present.

AGENDA #6 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck for approval of citizen's participation or comments. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Mike Major said regarding the Internal Controls item later on the agenda, he would like to know the commissioners' responses concerning items about routine meetings, assets, inventories and the monitoring and reviewing of the budget. Poindexter said ACCO has appraised assets for the county in order to make sure the correct buildings and amounts are insured. He said property and casualty insurance is going up from 20 to 40 percent, so more money will have to be budgeted for that expense. Poindexter said ACCO is still solvent but all the premiums are going up.

Major asked about fire departments, but fire departments are responsible for their own insurance coverage and budget.

Cossairt said the county had 131 employees with exits since the last meeting in detention, dispatch and two from the court clerk's office. She said one of the postings is for the E-911 Coordinator. This is the last day for the current coordinator, Don Youngblood. Cossairt said it is difficult to find people who want to work, and even more difficult to find applicants with the proper qualifications.

AGENDA #15-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter to approve agreement for work on private property in District 3 with Karen Rice. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #16-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve payment to Stolz Telecom in increments as equipment is delivered and work is completed. The total contract amount was approved February 7. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Paul Turner, who had been hired for HVAC maintenance, said the transformer to run the unit will be almost as large as the unit. Airco says they will fix the problem, but Callihan said he would rather have that unit taken down and the correct size unit installed. The D. A. has the contract with Airco to see what options are available, but he has not had a chance to look at it yet. The D. A. advised Callihan to table the item until the next meeting. A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Beck to table the item until the next meeting. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #20-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action feasibility study for fairgrounds project. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Callihan said one quote has been received at over \$40,000 and he is waiting on another one he expected to have before the meeting. No action was taken.

AGENDA #21-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve transfer of funds from personal services to travel in the amount of \$2,000 per Assessor. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #22-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve discussion of County-Wide Internal Controls Checklist for quarterly officers meeting; fiscal year 2022-2023. Callihan suggested the commissioners take turns doing these meetings with the elected officials and each one take a particular part of the checklist. Poindexter said that might be done as a preliminary step, but the actual meeting has to be conducted in a public setting. Poindexter directed the elected officials to page 5 of the checklist. He said insurance is going up up 20 to 40 percent next time, according to ACCO, the self-insured provider. He said that could mean the premium increasing from \$435,000 to \$600,000. He said a 10 percent cushion needs to be built into the budget, so changes would need to be made to pay the insurance bill.

Under item #2 of Monitoring, Barnes said although Bill Tuner has always prepared the county's financial statement, this year it was prepared in the County Clerk's Office. "We did our SEFA report this year," Barnes said. "The auditors said they would be more lenient if we do it and get it in on time." Turner was often late getting the statement complete.

Item #1 under monitoring has to do with handbooks and keeping up with current laws. Cossairt said the handbook was last updated in 2019 and she has been updating the BOCC on new laws. She said accidents drive up insurance costs and when they happen, Emergency Management Director Jeff Reeves and she do a root cause evaluation to try to prevent the accident from happening again. Callihan called attention to page three number 9, which asks if employees are made aware assets of the county are not for public use. Cossairt said everyone is trained in county policy, the handbook includes a policy about using county assets and every new hire signs a pledge stating they will not use county assets for personal reasons.

Poindexter said maybe a week before Internal Controls are put on the agenda, a commissioner could visit all the elected officials and "see what's on their radar."

AGENDA #24-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve Emergency Management Director Jeff Reeves to serve as interim E-911 Coordinator. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

E-911 Trust Authority Chairman Carl Tesreau said he is not sure if this will be necessary. The retired Ottawa County 911 director has agreed to help and can really "help catch us up." He is coming to look at the operation Thursday to see if he might serve as interim coordinator. The board would like Reeves to be available as an option.
