

DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES

April 11, 2023

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 9:00 a.m. on April 11, 2023. AGENDA #5 – A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve all monthly reports from officers. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. A report was submitted by the Election Board.

AGENDA #6 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck for approval of citizen's participation or comments. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. John Ordelhide provided photos and a packet to the commissioners in reference to agenda item #15, explaining why roadways in Indian Hills should not be vacated. Ordelhide said he will be harmed because the vacation will remove viable access to his property. He said the road he must use if the others are vacated is very steep and only one excavator he asked about building that road would even consider the job. Ordelhide said the road he is using should not be closed because the other way he has to access his property is too rough. Ordelhide said the Tuttles, who have asked for the vacation, built their house where the roads intersect. Ordelhide said since 1940 there has been a better way to access his property. Gerald Williams who inherited property in Indian Hills and lives in Bernice, said he is against closing any of the platted streets in Indian Hills Camp.

Attorney Clayton Baker said the matter was supposed to be set for public hearing on this agenda, but he prepared another resolution if the commissioners wished to approve a public hearing to be set for May 23.

Pewitt said he needs to "consult with Mr. Shoemaker" and a hearing date of May 23 may or may not work because "other people are involved."

AGENDA #7 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve report by Human Resources Vicki Cossairt. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Cossairt said the county had 127 employees Tuesday, but she will be conducting interviews all day beginning at 11 a.m. to try to fill some of the county's open positions.

AGENDA #8-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to open the floor for new business. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. There was none.

AGENDA #9- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve 308 apportionments. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #10- A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Callihan to approve two resolutions to remove #JP29899 and #JP29898 from the County Improvements for Roads and Bridges Transportation plan. These are bridges in District 3. Commissioner Beck said these are smaller jobs and removing them makes a spot to use CIRB funding on larger, more important projects. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #11- A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Callihan to open with possible acceptance sealed bids on painting the interior walls on the ground, second and third floors on behalf of Delaware County, located inside the Delaware County Courthouse. Bid #22-23/27. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. One bid was received from Brookside Construction in Grove for \$52,580. The bid stipulates the work will be done mostly on weekends and nights. Occupants of the offices will be required to move their furniture away from the walls. "Not a whole lot to think about if there's just one bid," Beck said. A motion was made by Callihan, seconded by Beck to accept the bid from Brookside Construction. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.
