

DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES

April 18, 2023

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 9:00 a.m. on April 18, 2023. The agenda was posted April 17, 2023 at 8:04 a.m. and placed in the kiosk located on the courthouse lawn as well as the county website. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Poindexter followed by the flag salute and roll call. All members were present.

Tesreau said no bids were received, so he researched other vendors and found some additional ones to send bid packets. AGENDA #19- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to receive and forward to the District Attorney case no. CV-2023-29; Jerry R. Sanders and Regina Sanders, Plaintiffs, Vs. Bennie Leon French, Et Al. Parker told the commissioners this is a quiet title. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #20- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action statutory mandatory annual jail inspection; per State Statute Title 57, Section 1. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. The item was moved to the end. Jail Administrator Katie Rothrock conducted the inspection. The commissioners were impressed with new paint in most of the jail. Rothrock pointed out spots where leaks in the ceiling are a constant problem. She demonstrated the new camera system and the commissioners got to see the control center where the video streams can be observed. The jail was way over capacity at over 100 inmates. There are 10 inmates with mental problems who have been in the jail over a year.

AGENDA #21- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve intrafund transfer from Monkey Island Fire Department Capital Outlay to Monkey Island Fire Department M&O, per Fire Chief Carl Tesreau, in the amount of \$1,000. Tesreau said his department is changing recording software for data transfer. He said the new software will hook into the current systems and automatically record time and day of a run and where it was, among other things. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #22- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action progress concerning the fairgrounds project was not needed as there was nothing new to report.

Callihan held up the amended proposed ARPA budget and said the money has been removed from the fairgrounds line item. Poindexter said he had not received the updated budget. "If was emailed to all of us," Callihan said. Beck gave Poindexter his copy. Poindexter said he talked to ARPA Attorney David Floyd at the ACCO convention, and they discussed the fact that the 911 Center is going to take a lot more money than was expected. "I guess my question is do the electeds want to pursue this or not?" Callihan said. Poindexter said he does, but it is a question of how much money will be available. Beck said, "if we get the grant money, we will be sitting a lot better."

"It just seems to me like everyone is not pulling the wagon in the same direction," Callihan said.

Tesreau said the grant committee meets today and will begin awarding grants, so word should come soon on whether the \$1.5 million grant is approved for the 911 Center.

AGENDA #23- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to adjourn at 10:00 a.m. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.
