

DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES

May 9, 2023

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 9:00 a.m. on May 9, 2023. The agenda was posted May 4, 2023, at 3:18 p.m. and placed in the kiosk located on the courthouse lawn as well as the county website. Members of the Board present were Commissioner David Poindexter-Chairman, Commissioner Jake Callihan-Member, Commissioner David Beck-Member and County Clerk Barbara Barnes -Secretary. The Board of Delaware County Commissioners is hereby authorized to act on the following items:

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Poindexter followed by the flag salute and roll call. All members were present.

Commissioner Callihan said the landscaping and yard mowing around the courthouse looks good.

Commissioner Poindexter announced the county got a \$1.3 million grant from the state for equipment and dispatching consoles for the new County-Wide E-911 Center. He said the grant is 80/20 matching, but some APRA funds will now be freed up for the fairgrounds expansion. Poindexter expressed thanks to the committee who researched and selected the equipment and to the new E-911 Board for their help.

AGENDA #5 – A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve all monthly reports from officers. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. A report was submitted by the Election Board.

AGENDA #6 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck for approval of citizen's participation or comments. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. There were none.

AGENDA #7 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to hear a report by Human Resources Director Vicki Cossairt. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Cossairt said the county has 135 full-time employees and five in process. There are 21 job postings including 17 full-time, three seasonal and one part-time. Cossairt urged anyone who knows a job hunter to let them know the county offers competitive wages and good benefits.

Cossairt said classes on reasonable suspicion drug and alcohol testing, which are required for all supervisors, will be offered in Pryor May 30. She said there are two officials who need to take the training. Cossairt said AAVCOR will come to the county at a minimal cost to offer the training for as many people who want to take it. "We might as well refresh if we are going to train," Cossairt said.

AGENDA #8-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to open the floor for new business. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Poindexter asked Jail Administrator Rothrock about power surge issues which have caused problems in the courthouse. She said for the last four to six months, starting on Friday about 8 p.m. until Sunday, the lights flicker, the jail computer servers are lost, computers have been ruined and four water heaters were burned out. "It's only on the weekend," Rothrock said. "Our electrician thinks the pot farm is causing a back feed." Callihan said he has a contact at PSO and he will call for information. He said Jay Mayor Becki Farley told him no one else in town has complained about power surges. Callihan said the pot farm is in the old Kelly's Store building. Callihan said an electrician advised him PSO can install a surge protector to prevent the losses.

Callihan said Airco is "stringing us along" on the HVAC unit which is out of service. D. A. Doug Pewitt said he had just gotten off the phone with Airco and was assured both a new single-phase unit and a step-down transformer will ship today or tomorrow. Pewitt said he sent Airco a letter to inform the company it is in breach of contract. "We may have to bid again to get a different vendor," Pewitt said. "They've been saying two days for two months," Callihan said. "Paul (the owner of Airwise, who is the HVAC maintenance contractor) has one now, and it's less than \$25,000." Pewitt said that would help as the county does not have to bid purchases under \$25,000. "If they can't commit to having something on the building in the next few days, it may be time to go the other direction," Pewitt said.

AGENDA #9- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to receive and file a copy of certificate of liability insurance and current list of Board of Directors and Officers for the Butler Volunteer Fire Department as follows:

AGENDA #10- A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Callihan to approve intrafund transfer from OSU Extension Personal Services in the amount of \$3,000 to OSU Extension Travel per Brooke Downing, Ag Educator – CED. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #11- A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Callihan to approve lease purchase agreement between Delaware County District 1 and Warren Cat for a Caterpillar Model 150 motor grader at a purchase price of \$361,158, using Sourcewell Contract #032119-CAT. Paid \$180,000 down, financed \$181,158 with monthly installments in the amount of \$2,566.24. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #12- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action resolution concerning rules for utility and cable companies working on public roads, rights-of-way and easements, tabled from May 9th meeting. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Callihan asked if a letter and the resolution ought to be sent to the utility companies, and for the resolution to be posted on the county website. The other commissioners agreed. "We just had a waterline put in about four inches," Callihan said. "That will not work." A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Beck to approve the resolution. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #13-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to receive and file affidavit of mailing notice of hearing for Petition to Vacate Roadway; Mark Tuttle and Janice Tuttle petitioners. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #14- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action resolution for Delaware County roads standards tabled at May 2nd meeting. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

"This is the same premise as the other resolution," Poindexter said, "except this concerns roads we will accept into the county system." He said the district attorney has approved the document. A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Beck to approve the road standards resolution. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #15- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve appointment of Crystal January by the State Election Board to the position of Delaware County Election Board Secretary at an annual salary of \$40,864. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #16- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve Memorandum of Agreement between Delaware County and the homeowners on 602 Loop for a donation paving project per Commissioner Callihan. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #17- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve a resolution adopting 2023 Delaware County Hazard Mitigation Plan update. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Reeves said this plan will be submitted to the state for approval June 1. He said from there it will go to FEMA, and it should be back by September. Poindexter asked if the schools were involved and Reeves said all the schools participated.

AGENDA #18- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action agenda deadline Thursday at noon, posting agenda Thursday end of day per Commissioner Callihan. Emergency items will fall under new business. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. "This is a resolution we passed and voted on before, and I just want to reinforce the deadline which is noon on Thursday," Callihan said. The Commissioners' Secretary asked if the commissioners will agree to her filing the agenda at the end of the day Thursday. Poindexter said that is fine if the document is sent to the commissioners for approval first. Parker said she always sends it for approval before it is filed. D. A. Pewitt said there is a minimum requirement to how long an agenda must be posted before a meeting, but no reason it cannot be posted longer, so there is no reason not to file it on Thursday. Parker said the resolution about the agenda deadline is posted on the county website.
