

## **DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES**

June 27, 2023

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 9:00 a.m. on June 27, 2023. The agenda was posted June 22, 2023, at 3:22 p.m. and placed on the courthouse door as well as the county website. Members of the Board present were Commissioner David Poindexter-Chairman, Commissioner Jake Callihan-Member, Commissioner David Beck-Member and County Clerk Barbara Barnes -Secretary. The Board of Delaware County Commissioners is hereby authorized to act on the following items:

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Poindexter followed by the flag salute and roll call. All members were present.

AGENDA #1 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to determine that notice of meeting and agenda for this meeting was properly posted in accordance with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #2-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve introductions and announcements. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. In addition to the Commissioners, County Clerk and Commissioners' Secretary Kathy Parker, Monkey Island Fire Chief Carl Tesreau, Emergency Management Director Jeff Reeves, Treasurer Susan Duncan, Mary Martin of OSU HCE, Carolyn Boothe, Mike Major and Bill Shaw of BOLT Fiber Optics introduced themselves.

Poindexter said Solid Waste is sponsoring a free brush drop at the main station between Jay and Kansas until Sunday for residents only. He said this is Duncan's last week as Treasurer and thanked her for her service.

Beck said concrete is scheduled to be poured on the bridge at Kenwood tomorrow and he expects Green Country Road to reopen next week.

AGENDA #6 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck for approval of citizen's participation or comments. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Mary Martin of OSU Extension asked about the fairgrounds project.

Callihan said the steering committee has been having regular meetings, the last with the Myers – Cherry architects to get a dollar amount for building to the specs the committee has for the fairgrounds building. Callihan said as soon as that number is presented, the commissioners can vote on whether or not to proceed with the project.

Mike Major said regarding item #16, he approves of what Monkey Island is doing to help Bernice, but this is a symptom of volunteer fire departments. Major said the BOCC should review all the volunteer fire departments and see how they should be managed to the best advantage of the county.

AGENDA #7 was not needed because Human Resources Director Vicki Cossairt was absent.

AGENDA #8-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded Commissioner Beck to open the floor for new business. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. There was none.

AGENDA #9- A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Callihan to sign affidavits for the June 30 payroll. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #10- A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Callihan to receive and forward to the District Attorney petition for condemnation, Case #CV-23-96, KAMO Electric Cooperative vs. White Goose, LLC, Et Al. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Parker said the District Attorney has already answered the petition. A copy is attached to the motion. She said the petition is to secure land for a substation.

AGENDA #11- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to pay final two invoices to Floyd & Driver for American Rescue Plan Act Professional Services for May and June at a cost of \$7,594.54 each (\$15,189.08). Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #12-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to appoint Todd Franke to the Eastern Oklahoma Library System Board of Trustees per provision of the Oklahoma Library Code 65 O. S. 1981, Section 4-103(B). Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #13- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action telephone service for the Delaware County Courthouse and Courthouse Annex. County Purchasing Agent previously requested three

vendor phone quotes regarding telephone service and no responses were received. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Bill Shaw was present representing BOLT for Tim Trease, who has been handling the phone quote. Shaw and Poindexter discussed how site visits should be conducted to "see what we've got." Barnes pointed out Trease has already made the necessary site visit. She said the phones in the D.A.'s office were down completely last Thursday and that is scary because 911 dispatch is dependent on the phones.

AGENDA #14- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to designate the following officers for the 2023-2024 fiscal year regarding the County General account: Requisitioning – Barbara Barnes and David Poindexter; Receiving – Vici Kirby, Rachel Karleskint and Teresa Gross; Inventory – Frances Fanning. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #15- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action renewing annual commissary and inmate telephone agreements. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #16- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve fire service and consulting agreement between the Town of Bernice and the Monkey Island Fire Protection District. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Tesreau said this is the same contract used for the last four years, with the exception of the fact that Bernice will buy bulk fuel now, thereby saving a lot of the cost of at the pump fuel. He said the Bernice Town Council would like the arrangement with Monkey Island to be their long-term fix for fire and EMS service, but there is a lot of red tape associated with that change. Tesreau said the attorneys are looking at how the transfer will be accomplished.

AGENDA #17- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve lake access project number SAP-221D(067)LG in District #3. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Beck said the road is north of Lake Eucha in Rock Acres north. Parker said there is a mistake on the first page of the agreement. A road number is wrong. She called Jessica Kratchmer at ODOT who said she would send a corrected first page, but it has not arrived.

Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #21- A motion was made by Commissioner Beck and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter to discuss with possible action progress concerning fairgrounds project. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Callihan said the steering committee met June 21 with the architects to get a ballpark dollar amount of how much the building will cost.

AGENDA #22- A motion was made by Commissioner Beck and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter to adjourn at 9:27 a.m. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.
