

DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES

May 10, 2022

Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #6- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve all monthly reports submitted by officers. Reports were submitted from the Election Board and Court Clerk. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #7 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck for approval of citizen's participation or comments. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Danny Duncan said he is from the "south end District 3." He welcomed Commissioner Beck to his new position and asked what plans Beck has to get the roads in shape in District #3, If Beck has made a report about theft of tools at the county barn and whether the sales tax will be on the ballot. The commissioners told Duncan the sales tax continuation question will be on the ballot. Duncan asked if he could have a copy of the measure as it will appear on the ballot because "the south end is clueless." Beck said he is working on the roads as fast as possible, but "rain has destroyed everything I've done.". Duncan asked Beck how much equipment he has. Beck said he now has five operational graders and now new hires are being trained to run them. Beck said he has reached out to Cherokee Nation, Oklahoma Department of Conservation and FEMA for help.

Duncan asked if there if there is a tool theft investigation because "a lot of tools have been lost." Beck said no tools have been lost since he started, but he is not sure what was there before. "I suggest you take a hard look at what's going on there." Duncan said. "It's hard to do your job if you don't have the tools to do it with."

AGENDA #8 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve report by Human Resources Vicki Cossairt. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Cossairt said Covid measures have been lifted in the county, but people should still be diligent about hand washing, disinfection and social distancing. "Covid hasn't disappeared," Cossairt said. Cossairt said county job postings are on the web at okcounties.org and in the kiosk outside the courthouse front door. She said a new driver has begun work in District #1, District #3 has a new seasonal worker equipment operator, and full-time operator who worked for the county before and can also do mechanics. She said one more part-time worker will be starting soon.

AGENDA #9- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to advertise for sealed bids on annual uniform service. Bids will be opened and reviewed May 31, at 9 a.m. will possible acceptance at a later date. Bids will be received no later than 2 p.m. in the County Clerk's Office on May 27. Attorney Tommy Dyer told the commissioners proof of publication were provided. Mail notices were not required in this instance, he said. Dyer said the Fidlers have purchased the former Spencer Ridge property, making the first road in question entirely inside their property. "The other road is about a mile east," Dyer said. "Some of the property is in Adair County, but the road is in Delaware County. In fact, there have been gates on this one for many years. I have found no easements and I am not even sure it's a county road." Fidler said it is completely over grown with trees growing in what would be the road. Dyer said 30 miles of trails have been developed on Fidlers' property for ATVs. Fidler said it is a 1,000-acre RZR park. "We've doubled the width of the county road," Fidler said.

The discussion changed course to the county road which is maintained by the county. Fidler said it is dangerous for the ATVs to cross and he wondered if the county would put a cattle guard in the road as a kind of speed bump, "or something to slow traffic." Wright said cattle guards are no longer allowed to be put in county roads, and the state is trying to get rid of the ones it has. This has been a particular problem in western Oklahoma, Wright said. He suggested solar flashing signs. Poindexter said he uses several of the flashing signs and they are effective. Fidler asked if "some steel thing" could be put over the road. The commissioners suggested trying signs and revisiting the issue if it is a problem. Beck asked how much traffic there is on the road. Fidler said not much now, but there will be a lot.

No one appeared in opposition to either petition, so the commissioners passed but vacation requests.
