AGENDA #3- A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Martin to approve and file all monthly reports from officers. Reports were presented from the Sheriff, Court Clerk and Election Board. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Martin-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #4- A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Martin to accept six-month road material bids for Delaware County Highway Departments. All submitted bids were accepted. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Martin-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #5- A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Martin to open sealed bids on annual election ballots with possible acceptance. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Martin-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

Bids were opened from Mid-West Printing and Royal Printing.

"Who do we use now?" Poindexter said.

Martin said Mid-West is the current supplier. Reading the bid, Martin said Royal is the same price on some items and higher on some items.

Kirk said said the Mid-West bid is "14 straight across the board."

Poindexter asked what size ballots are used. Election Board Secretary Crystal January said 8 ½" ballots are used on small elections and 17" ballots are used on larger elections.

"We've always used Mid-West," January said, because of reliability and proximity. She said Mid-West was her preferred bid.

Martin made a motion to accept the Mid-West bid that was seconded by Poindexter. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Martin-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #6- A motion was made by Commissioner Martin and seconded by Commissioner Kirk to approve and sign the contract for secure detention services with Texas County Juvenile Detention Center for fiscal year 2019-2020. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Martin-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #7- A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Martin to approve an annual maintenance and lease agreement between the Delaware County Sheriff's Office and Lakeland Office Systems. AGENDA #8- A motion was made by Commissioner Martin and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter to approve discussion of on-site service agreement with Smith's Detection and Delaware Count Sheriff's office for the x-ray scanner at the courthouse entrance in the amount of \$4,260. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Martin-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

"This is for service and maintenance?" Poindexter said.

"Yes," said Undersheriff Tracy Shaw.

"Is this for the fiscal year?" Martin said.

Shaw said this company is the sole proprietor for this machine.

"What if we don't sign and just call them on an as needed basis?" Kirk said. "That way we don't spend \$4,000 when we don't need to."

Shaw said it is his understanding a large portion of the amount is for a yearly check of the equipment for radiation leaks, which is required.

Kirk asked how many service calls are included in this amount and if any parts are included. He asked if travel is included in the amount. Shaw did not know the answer to any of those questions.

Assessor Lorena Ellis-Cook asked if the amount covers software for the scanning program.

AGENDA #9- A motion was made by Commissioner Martin and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter to approve a credit application to ADI of New York on behalf of the Sheriff's Office (\$25,000 limit). Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Martin-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried. "Is this a service agreement?" Poindexter asked.

"It's not a credit card, it's opening an account with their company," Shaw said, explaining that some doors in the jail need replacement parts and they are only available from the manufacturing company. "Oddly, it's cheaper for us to buy them than for the locksmith to buy them."

"This is the people who put the locks in," Martin said.
