Vicki Cossairt, HR Director, reported that there have been 5252 diagnosed cases of COVID increased by 134 from last week; 100 deaths an increase of 1 from last week; 4952 recovered increased by 117 from last week; 200 active cases increase of 16 from last week. The case numbers are still trending at an increase. Across the state Risk Level color map indicates there are only two counties that are the lowest risk level of green Beaver & Alfalfa Counties. In the Southwest portion of the state there are 12 counties at risk level yellow and the rest of the state risk level orange. CDC has mandated masks even for vaccinated people due to the number of unvaccinated people. The Delaware County Health department has announced via Facebook they will be accepting walk-ins on the 3rd, 4th & 5th from 9am – 4pm for anyone wanting the vaccine, first and second doses. They are closed from 12 – 1 for lunch daily. Insurance update for using facilities that provided services and being charged for out of network for the services, new legislature will make a change and all services will be in network. Attending training regarding the new legislation and will have more details following the training.
