



DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES

January 20, 2026

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 1:00 p.m. on January 20, 2026. The agenda was posted Jan. 15, 2026, at 4:11 p.m. and placed in the kiosk on the courthouse lawn as well as the county website. Members of the Board present were Commissioner David Poindexter-Chairman, Commissioner Jake Callihan-Member, Commissioner David Beck-Member and County Clerk Barbara Barnes. The Board of Delaware County Commissioners is hereby authorized to act on the following items:

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Poindexter followed by the flag salute and roll call. All members were present.

AGENDA #1 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to determine that notice of meeting and agenda for this meeting was properly posted in accordance with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. Poindexter said he attended a jail management seminar last week in OKC with statewide participation. He said he learned some interesting statutory guideline and jail layout ideas for expansion, some using modular buildings. He said ACCO is having a courthouse security seminar June 8-10. Callihan said his office is open in the new location for the first time today. The office is moved and operating but not all the equipment has been moved.

Cossairt said a new IRS law allows county employees to use telehealth SwiftMD with no charge upfront. Employees may also pay with their HSA account. Vision Care Direct, a provider for county vision insurance, has changed its name to Unity Vision. Cossairt said a new CDL driver has been licensed in District 2 and another candidate will complete the program in March.

The amount financed of \$150,000 was bid at a fixed rate of 3.93% with a payment of \$2,764.96 a month on a five-year note and \$2,059.14 on a seven-year note. The bid was take under advisement by Fire Chief Bandon Alexander.






