

DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES

October 14, 2025

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 1:00 p.m. on October 14, 2025. The agenda was posted Oct. 9, 2025, at 3:50 p.m. and placed in the kiosk on the courthouse lawn as well as the county website. Members of the Board present were Commissioner David Poindexter-Chairman, Commissioner Jake Callihan-Member, Commissioner David Beck-Member and County Clerk Barbara Barnes. Speakers should hold their comments to three minutes. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Rocky Carroll said concerning item #11, he would like to thank Mr. Marts for his service on the excise board.

AGENDA #7- Was not needed.

AGENDA #8- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to open the floor for new business. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. There was none.

AGENDA #9- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action REAP grant application for Jay Schools. Asst. Superintendent Jeff Gibe said the grant will extend the canopy from the elementary school to the safe room making fifth and sixth graders safer. That walkway also extends from the parking lot where people would park who are coming to the community safe room. The total amount for the project is \$74, 877.54. A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Poindexter to approve the REAP application for Jay Public Schools. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #10- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action legal services agreement with David Floyd. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Poindexter said the hourly rate of \$250 can be billed in 10-minute increments for phone calls. There is no retainer. A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Beck to accept the contract with David Floyd. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #11- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action letter of resignation from Excise Board Member Charles Marts. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Poindexter read the letter. Barnes said the position occupied by Marts is appointed by the Senator for District 3 and the time served usually follows the commissioner's term. She said each board member is selected by a different entity. A motion was made by Poindexter and seconded by Callihan to accept the resignation letter. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #12- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action REAP grant application for District #2. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Callihan said this would be funds to help refurbish the old fairgrounds to turn the property into the District 2 barn. He said he got one quote, but

it was way over the grant amount. Reeves said when it arrives, possibly a concrete pad and cover could be set up for the new command center trailer at that site. He said that would be a good central location. Callihan agreed. Beck said he is interested in using the old District 2 barn as a place to work on equipment inside. The other commissioners agreed this should not be a problem as the county has a 99-year lease on the property from Solid Waste. A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Beck to submit the REAP application to Grand Gateway on behalf of District 2. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #13- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to accept/reject proposal to move District 2 barn to the old fairgrounds. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Beck to move the District 2 barn to the old fairgrounds. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #14- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve of an interfund transfer from ETR fund (7506) to CBRI (1103) for District #3 in the amount of \$323,900 per District 3 Commissioner David Beck. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #15- No action was taken on this item. It died for lack of a motion.

AGENDA #16- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to sign the contract for bid accepted from Stewart's Asphalt and Paving for chip and seal project in District #2. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #17- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to open sealed bids regarding bridge rehabilitation for Delaware County District #3 with possible acceptance. County re-bid #25-26/04. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. One bid was submitted by Contech Engineered Solutions for \$70,900. Poindexter said he has seen their work in Ottawa County and it was very good. Beck said he already has a Contech bridge at Kenwood.
