

DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES

October 21, 2025

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 9:00 a.m. on October 21, 2025. The agenda was posted Oct. 20, 2025, at 8:39 a.m. and placed in the kiosk on the courthouse lawn as well as the county website. Members of the Board present were Commissioner David Poindexter-Chairman, Commissioner Jake Callihan-Member, Commissioner David Beck-Member and County Clerk Barbara Barnes. The Board of Delaware County Commissioners is hereby authorized to act on the following items:

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Poindexter followed by the flag salute and roll call. All members were present.

AGENDA #1 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to determine that notice of meeting and agenda for this meeting was properly posted in accordance with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #2-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve introductions and announcements. In addition to the commissioners and county clerk, Commissioners' Assistant Kathy Parker, Rocky and Connie Carroll, Undersheriff Joe White, ADA Pam Ireland, Carolyn Boothe, Emergency Management Director Jeff Reeves, OSU Extension Agent Brooke Downing, Election Board Secretary Crystal January, Jack Wood, County Clerk Deputy Teresa Gross, Sheriff Ray Thomas, Human Resources Director Vicki Cossairt, and Luke Elliott of Delaware County Health Department introduced themselves. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Rocky Carroll produced a newspaper article detailing the new Cherokee Nation Historic Cemeteries Preservation Act, which authorizes funds to identify, document and restore historic Cherokee cemeteries. Carroll has been working to get his family cemetery maintenance and access as a Cherokee cemetery. He has been trying to get the BOCC to take over the access to the cemetery, but since the land is not a prescription cemetery, the BOCC has no control over it. He is hoping his family cemetery can now be recognized under this act.

Speakers should hold their comments to three minutes. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. There were none.

AGENDA #7- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to hear report by Human Resources Director Vicki Cossairt. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Cossairt said the county has 136 employees this week. Since her report two weeks ago, there has been one hire, five terminations and one promotion. She said October is flu shot month. She said longevity checks will be distributed Nov. 21. Cossairt urged everyone who uses prescriptions to fill them before the new year to avoid the beginning of paying the new insurance deductible. She said training has been scheduled for Sheriff's Office employees concerning what to do if they are injured on the job. Cossairt said she has developed wallet cards with this information. Cossairt said employees who are hurt and do not tell anyone until a month later cannot get their bills paid.

AGENDA #9- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to sign highway cash for November. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #10- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to sign blanket purchase orders for November. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #11- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to open sealed bids on 2026 resale title search on behalf of the County Treasurer's Office with possible acceptance. County bid #25-26/03. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Poindexter read the letter. Barnes said the position occupied by Marts is appointed by the Senator for District 3 and the time served usually follows the commissioner's term. She said each board member is selected by a different entity. A motion was made by Poindexter and seconded by Callihan to accept the resignation letter. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #12- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to advertise for sealed bids on highway salt materials for the county highway departments through march 31, 2026. AGENDA #13- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action written agreement to vacate easement on Fox Pointe plat per ADA Pam Ireland. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Callihan said this is District 2 and no county roads are involved. A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Beck to vacate the easement in Fox Pointe. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #14- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to advertise for sealed bids to sell a 1999 Parker boat with dual motors and trailer for the Lakemont Shores Fire Department. Callihan asked if this boat was purchased with sales tax. Fire Chief Josh Rowe said it was. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #15- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action quote from Kellpro for installation of wiring making it possible to use high speed internet in the amount of \$18,544.60. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexteryes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Barnes said this is for the County Clerk's Office. She said Kellpro recently worked on the system and discovered that although BOLT is being paid for high-speed internet, the outdated wiring will not support it. Barnes said the high speed is necessary because payroll is done on this system and it handles all the county's records. A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Callihan to accept the quote and pay for the upgrade from the Use Tax account. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #16- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to accept a bid from Allison Fuller in the amount of \$20 for Flint Ridge 1 Amended Lot 52 Block 1 Bear Lake Area on behalf of the County Treasurer. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexteryes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #17- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action MOU with Cowskin Fire Department to place tornado siren at their Station 1 on Highway 10 per Emergency Manager Jeff Reeves. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Reeves presented the MOU for signatures. These sirens are being paid for by a grant he secured. He said there will be other MOUs to place more sirens. Reeves said FEMA requires the MOUs before the sirens may be placed. A motion was made by Poindexter and seconded by Callihan to accept and sign the MOU. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #18- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action REAP grant application from Kansas School. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Kim Bowman said the school numbers enrolled have increased significantly causing the need to open old modules, some as many as 27 years old – for classrooms, band, and art rooms. These modules need new HVAC units. A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Beck to accept the application for Kansas School. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #19- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to receive and forward to the District Attorney case #CV-2025-140, Zach and Denisha Woodcock, Et Al, Petition to Vacate Park and Portion of Roadways in Oak Ridge subdivision. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.
