

## DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES

## May 20, 2025

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 9:00 a.m. on May 20, 2025. The agenda was posted May 19, 2025, at 8:30 a.m. and placed in the kiosk on the courthouse lawn as well as the county website. Members of the Board present were Commissioner David Poindexter-Chairman, Commissioner Jake Callihan-Member, Commissioner David Beck-Member and County Clerk Barbara Barnes. The Board of Delaware County Commissioners is hereby authorized to act on the following items:

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Poindexter followed by the flag salute and roll call. All members were present.

AGENDA #1 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to determine that notice of meeting and agenda for this meeting was properly posted in accordance with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #2-A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve introductions and announcements. Rocky Carroll said concerning items #19 and #20, there is an article concerning preservation and protection of county items somewhere, possibly AARP. Cossairt asked about the insurance assessment on #23. Whether this is an extra amount, if all counties were assessed the same rate and where the county ranks in assessment. Poindexter read parts of the letter from ACCO and clarified each entity was assessed on its own. This is an additional amount to the regular premium caused by excessive claims the past four years, the largest and most of which were from sheriff's offices.

AGENDA #7- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to hear a report from Human Resources Director Vicki Cossairt. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Cossairt said the county has 132 employees today. Since last week, two new employees are in the hiring process. Eight full-time and two part-time positions are open for county employment.

Cossairt said SB 20 addresses ODOT standards for CDL drivers which will include proof of American citizenship, current work visas and English as the standard language, including reading and speaking. She said the county already verifies these standards. She distributed the guidelines for work exemption of pay standards.

Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Callihan said he called a company a while back to fix roof leaks. He said the leaks in the Treasurer's office seem to be fixed. The roof leaked again Sunday in the D.A.'s Office, but not in the torrential rains yesterday and last night. Callihan said he has obtained a quote to seal the roof.

Callihan made a motion, seconded by Beck, to reject the bid from Brookside Construction. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #20- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss Delaware County School bid specs. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Callihan said the old wood floor is rotted, so it would make sense to replace the floor at the same time as the roof. He suggested a concrete floor that is a four-inch slab. Callihan also suggested putting in blank lines for future plumbing. Barnes will work on the bid specs with these changes.

AGENDA #21- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to accept donation from Cherokee Nation in the amount of \$23,735.50 for a speaker, microphone, and radios on behalf of the Sheriff's Office. Thomas qualified the amount as \$1 more at \$23,736.50. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #22- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to accept the designation of officers on behalf of the Sheriff's Office as follows: Requisitioning/Purchasing Officers – Joe White, Samantha Demereck; Receiving Officers – Lisa Reed, Josh Bynum; Inventory Officers – Joe White, Lisa Reed, Josh Bynum, Kassidy Daugherty. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #23- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action letter from ACCO concerning additional insurance assessment payment of \$174,930. Poindexter said in the last four fiscal years, ACCO insurance has lost \$13.5 million in claims statewide. Most of this has come from lawsuits to Sheriff's Offices. Cossairt asked if ACCO is providing any training to keep this number down. Thomas said Fred Clark is a consultant ACCO hired to guide Sheriff's Offices. Callihan said Clark is planning a class for the county concerning running the jail. Thomas said he is now analyzing every car crash and training is coming on the use of cars and pursuit. Cossairt said she and Reeves have been completing wreck analysis for a while in an effort to lower the number of insurance claims for wrecks. The commissioners agreed to pay the amount in a lump sum from the county's contingency account. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.
