DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER MEETING MINUTES

May 28, 2024

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 9:00 a.m. on May 28, 2024. The agenda was posted May 24, 2024, at 4:19 p.m. and placed in the kiosk on the courthouse lawn well as the county website. Members of the Board present were Commissioner David Poindexter-Chairman, Commissioner Jake Callihan-Member, Commissioner David Beck-Member, and County Clerk Barbara Barnes. The Board of Delaware County Commissioners is hereby authorized to act on the following items:

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Poindexter followed by the flag salute and roll call. All members were present.

AGENDA #1 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to determine that notice of meeting and agenda for this meeting was properly posted in accordance with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

In addition to the Commissioners and County Clerk, Commissioners' Assistant Kathy Parker, Assistant District Attorney Marianna McKnight, Human Resources Director Vicki Cossairt, Jack Wood, Mike Major, Rocky and Connie Carroll, Undersheriff Nick O'Neal, Emergency Management Director Jeff Reeves, Monkey Island Fire Chief Carl Tesreau, Kristen O'Herin from the Health Department and Carolyn Boothe introduced themselves. Commissioner Beck extended thanks to everyone who has helped with the damage from the tornado that hit the south end of the county early Sunday morning. He especially wanted to thank Jeff Reeves, Carl Tesreau, and local fire departments. He thanked the Cherokee Nation and Senator Tom Wood who came to access the damage. Also, he said he wanted to thank his crew for working through their holiday.

AGENDA #7- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to hear Human Resources report by Human Resources Director Vicki Cossairt. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Cossairt said the county has 134 full-time employees today. One new hire is in progress and six new employees began work last week. A meeting is scheduled for 5:30 today to work on the dispatch transition to the new E-911 Center. Cossairt also thanked everyone who worked in the aftermath of the tornado.

AGENDA #8- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to open the floor for new business. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Emergency Management Director Jeff Reeves said a declaration of disaster has been prepared for District 3 and he will be presenting it to the State of Oklahoma after the meeting to get the process started for disaster funds. Reeves said around midnight Sunday, south Delaware County experienced an EF1, possibly EF2 tornado. Reeves said there is extensive tree and home damage. He said preliminary assessments will be made Thursday and Friday and he will have an official count for the commissioners next week. Reeves said the tribes have responded well, but bottled water is still needed for the many residents that have well water. He said the event is going smoothly and everyone is working together. Reeves said a Red Cross shelter is set up in the Colcord Community Center. Hot meals will be provided there today for first responders and any other victims who need them. He said REC estimates it will be the weekend before all the electricity is restored.

Commissioner Callihan said the fair board would like to take bids for baling the grass instead of just bush hogging it down and return the proceeds to the board. A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Poindexter to bale the hay off the new fairgrounds property and return the proceeds to the fair board. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #16- A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Beck to approve fiscal year 2024-2025 officers for the District Attorney's Office as follows: Requisitioning – Douglas S. Pewitt and Niovonni Cox; Receiving Officers – Julie Stonecipher and Nathan Jordan; Inventory Officers – Beth Spaulding and Julie Stonecipher. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #18- A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Beck to sign annual contract for child care with Craig County Detention Center at a cost of \$25 per day. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #19- A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Beck to discuss with possible action establishing Camp Bandage account for National Child Safety Council fundraiser checks per Sheriff's Office and if approved, to sign resolution. Tabled for D.A. review from May 21st meeting. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

ADA McKnight said these donations have nothing to do with Camp Bandage. She said the promised amounts are not actual checks. The donations are given to the National Child Safety Council and kept there for the Sheriff's Office to draw on the pay for products made by National

Child Safety Council to promote child safety. No money ever comes to the Sheriff's Office. The only action is to approve acceptance of the donations. A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Poindexter to accept the National Child Safety donations. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #20- A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Beck to advertise for sealed bids for the purchase of two used semi trucks for the Colcord Volunteer Fire Department.
