

DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES

July 29, 2025

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 9:00 a.m. on July 29, 2025. The agenda was posted July 28, 2025, at 8:43 a.m. and placed in the kiosk on the courthouse lawn as well as the county website. Members of the Board present were Commissioner David Poindexter-Chairman, Commissioner Jake Callihan-Member, Commissioner David Beck-Member. County Clerk Barbara Barnes was absent. The Board of Delaware County Commissioners is hereby authorized to act on the following items:

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Poindexter followed by the flag salute and roll call. All commissioners were present. The county clerk was absent. Her first deputy Michaele Baker was present in her place.

AGENDA #6 - A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck for approval of citizen's participation or comments. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. There were none.

AGENDA #7- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to hear a report from Human Resources Director Vicki Cossairt. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Cossairt said the county has 129 employees today. Two new employees are in process this week. There was one new start and two promotions since the last report. The county has five open employment positions. Cossairt said six people are in week number three of CDL school. The school is seven weeks long.

Cossairt said HB 1178 becomes effective Nov. 1 and the county has already followed the process for service animals. Cossairt said the vo-tech school may offer training for grader operators in the future.

Cossairt said it is very hot and employees tend to act out in extreme heat and cold. She reminded electeds who have employees working outside to encourage proper hydration.

AGENDA #8- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to open the floor for new business. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. There was none.

AGENDA #9- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to sign affidavits for the July 31 payroll. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #10- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to discuss with possible action check received by the sheriff's office in the amount of \$35,000 from the City of Tulsa for patrolling at Lake Eucha, tabled from the July 22 meeting. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

Callihan said he will be attending a meeting tomorrow with all the interested parties, so he made a motion to table the item until August 5th. Beck seconded the motion. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #11- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to accept a bid from Dakota Harris in the amount of \$20 for Berry Hill Area Flint Ridge 4, Block 17, Lot 51 on behalf of the Treasurer's Office. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #12- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to appoint a representative to Grand Gateway Economic Development Authority. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Commissioner Poindexter said Erin Klocker of Grand Gateway called him to say it is important to have a member on the board from each of the counties Grand Gateway serves. A motion was made by Callihan and seconded by Beck to appoint David Poindexter to the Grand Gateway Economic Development board. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #13- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Beck to receive and forward to the insurance company tort claim filed by Jack Smith. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #14- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to sign CED #1 materials request grant application in the amount of \$50,000 for District #2. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #17- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve a borrow agreement with Donald W. Harper for fill material on behalf of District #2. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #18- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to execute Form 969 Claim Form for loss of revenue to Delaware County and the school districts therein due to the exemption of new or expanded manufacturing facilities for tax year 2023. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #19- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to approve Bank of Grand Lake lease/purchase documents on the purchase of a 2025 Ford F550 flatbed truck purchased from Bob Moore Ford with the department paying half down for the Eucha Fire Department. State contract bid #SW35T. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #19- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to remove James Beck from the Delaware County E-911 Board and discuss with possible action appointing a new member. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Poindexter said absence from meetings is the reason to remove Beck from the board. Callihan said since that task was done with the first vote, he would make a motion to appoint Rick Pike to the board, which was seconded by Beck. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. E-911 Board Chairman Carl Tesreau confirmed this appointment fills the E-911 board.

AGENDA #21- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to adjourn the meeting at 9:27 a.m. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.
