Such notice shall describe the boundaries of the proposed district, shall state the time and place of the hearing, and shall state that any person may appear and protest the organization of the district or the proposed boundaries thereof. AGENDA #6-A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Martin to approve to hear Human Resources on current status regarding Families First Coronavirus: Vicki Cossairt, HR Director, reported that cases continue to increase with 370 diagnosed cases, 292 recovering, 78 active cases and 19 deaths. There has also been a huge spike in Ottawa County. The HR Director, EM Director and Board Chair are working together to disinfect the courthouse every Friday. It saves a tremendous amount of money for the county employees to do the disinfecting as opposed to hiring a professional company. The County Clerk's Office is working from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 Mon – Thurs without taking lunches or breaks. The County Clerk's Office does not have enough employees rotate staffs. The Treasurer's office is working from 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 Mon – Thurs. and alternating staffs. The Court Clerk's Office and Assessor's Office are working 8:00 to 4:30 Mon-Friday alternating staffs. The DA's office and Court System is working Mon-Fri 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. with alternating staffs. The Election Board is keeping their regular hours from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Mon-Fri. Courthouse offices are requiring masks in all offices for employees and are practicing social distancing Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Martin-yes, Commissioner Kirk-absent. Motion carried.
