AGENDA #34-A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter to open the floor for any new business. New business as follows: Commissioner Martin discussed the results of

the Courthouse Security Meeting held June 22, 2018. Commissioner Martin stated the doorways on the south end of the Courthouse by the Court Clerk and Treasurer's Office will now remain locked. Entry to the Courthouse for Public and Employees will now only be through the front doors on the East side of the Courthouse. Commissioner Martin stated there will be new keys made for all exterior doors. There is a plan to have an armed guard at the front door which will be paid out of the Courthouse Security Account. He stated it has been the first positive action in 3 years from the BOCC in regards to the Solid Waste Trust Authority and a good step in reclaiming oversight responsibilities. Majors asked to consider asking the same of the E-911 Trust Authority. Major also questioned whether the first meeting in July would be held to discuss the upcoming 2018/2019 budget. He also questioned the rationale for changing security in Courthouse. Commissioner Martin stated it has been an ongoing process with the HR Director and Friday was the first day to meet with Courthouse Officials concerning courthouse security.
