AGENDA #11 – A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Martin to approve to hear Candi Happy's concerns about East 571 Road, Colcord, OK located in District #3. Candi Happy said that she is very distressed about the condition of her road and that it is causing damage to her tires and vehicles. She wants to know why the grader operator only grades a road that hardly anyone travels and does not grade the roads where people are traveling such as school buses and the mail carrier. There are five miles of roads that never get touched. She wants to know what is going to be done and said that she had talked to Commissioner Kirk twice about the problem. Candi also said that the problem is so bad that a grader will not fix it. Commissioner Kirk said the problem is because there has been so much rain in the last year and it will take a while. Reese Hamilton spoke next about her road in Dist #3 and how the road is so rough that she bashed her head inside her vehicle and could have been seriously injured. Janie Leroy spoke about how her road (570 Rd) is so bad and there are three corners underwater and a seep hole has started running into her well. She had spoken with Conley Chesney about this problem three years ago and he said that he would return to get this fixed, however he has not been back to her place since. Leroy called back to

the barn and someone told her to get a shovel and fix it herself. She did not know who she had spoken with. Leroy said that she would like to sell her place, but cannot because of the condition of the well. Leroy asked if there was any hope of getting this fixed and Kirk said there is always hope. Kevin Hamilton said that he had come to the meeting to ask for a letter of resignation from District #3 Commissioner and if he could not get it, he planned on starting a petition to remove District #3 Commissioner. Hamilton said District #3 residents would be just as well off without a commissioner. Kirk said he had money and was going to start doing some paving. Hamilton said he calls the District #3 barn and no one answers the phone. Again, Hamilton asked for a resignation. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Martin-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #12 – A motion was made by Commissioner Martin and seconded by Commissioner Kirk to approve to go into Executive Session pursuant to title 25 Oklahoma Statute 307- B-1 to discuss employment, promotion, demotion, discipling or resignation of any individual or salaried public officer or Employee. AGENDA #15- A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Martin to approve to open the floor for Citizen's participation or public comments. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Martin-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried. Danny Duncan said that Flint Road is the worst he has ever seen. We are driving in the ditch and this should not be this way because it is a major collector road. Duncan said a major collector road should be fixed. Duncan said that New Life Ranch has the worst paving job that he has ever seen in all of his life. It's so bad, I've had to quit driving on it, Duncan said. Duncan said he has to go to Arkansas 43 Highway to get to his property. Also, Duncan said that there is a road North of Colcord that he had talked with Commissioner #3 about previously Duncan said there needs to be a sign that 18-wheel trucks cannot go through there. Kirk said that the sign had just come in and he would get it put up. Duncan said that the 18-wheel trucks are destroying the road. Duncan asked what the plan was for New Life Ranch Road. Commissioner Poindexter said that funds have been cut across the state, but should be more money available this summer to help District #3. Duncan said these roads are so bad that the front end could be torn out of a traveling vehicle. Next Shay Duncan spoke about her road in District #3 that was so rough that her daughter refused to ride the school bus. She would like something done to correct the condition of the road. Duncan said that when the county does get out there that they are cutting into their fence line and their fence will end up laying in the middle of the road. Also, she said that she is embarrassed when there are burials at Row Cemetery because the roads are so bad on the way to the cemetery.
