

DELAWARE COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S MEETING MINUTES

December 17, 2024

The Board of County Commissioners of Delaware County met in Regular Session at 9:00 a.m. on December 17, 2024. The agenda was posted December 16, 2024, at 8:30 a.m. and placed in the kiosk on the courthouse lawn as well as the county website. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Rocky Carroll asked about members of the library board. He said the public should be involved in choosing those members. The BOCC does not choose nor appoint members of the library board.

AGENDA #7- A motion was made by Commissioner Callihan and seconded by Commissioner Beck to hear report by Human Resources Director Vicki Cossairt. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried. Cossairt said the county has 137 employees today. Since her last report, one termination has been made, and one new hire is in process. There are six county jobs open.

Cossairt said if an employee has a worker's compensation claim, a WC form 2 must be completed by a supervisor or elected official. The employee may not fill out this form themselves. That form is given to both Cossairt and Payroll Clerk Tayla Douglas. Cossairt said a drug and alcohol screen will be performed for every occurrence, no matter what the claim is. A medical check must be performed before the employee can return to work, no matter what the occurrence is.

Cossairt said hiring a new employee normally takes one to two weeks. She said in a perfect world, a new hire might be made in a few days. Cossairt said the hams for the employee performance and recognition program will be distributed today. She said she and Emergency Manager Jeff Reeves will pick the hams up from the vendor and the elected officials will distribute them to their employees. Cossairt said those elected officials should tell their employees thank you.

Poindexter said he is fine with keeping the appointment if no one else wants it, but the district extends to Tahlequah and beyond so some of the meetings are a distance away. Beck said he is willing to take the position. A motion was made by Poindexter and seconded by Callihan to appoint Beck. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes; Commissioner Callihan-yes; and Commissioner Beck-yes. Motion carried.
