Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Martin-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried. Reports were submitted by the Health Dept and County Assessor.

AGENDA #4-A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Martin to approve Hearing Human Resources Vici Cossairt on current status regarding families first Coronavirus. Roll Call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes Commissioner Martin-yes Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried. Vicki Cossairt, HR Director, reported that cases continue to increase with 540 diagnosed cases, up 36 from last week, 21 deaths, 462 recovered, up by 38 and 57 active cases, down by 5. Encouraged to review mental health due to possible impact to personnel resulting from isolation or additional stress, make everyone aware of the resources and where to find them if needed. The hours of the courthouse offices are unchanged from last week with rotating staffs except for the County Clerk that does not have enough staff to rotate. Review, the courthouse is still being sanitized each Friday and common areas and restrooms cleaned several times a day by maintenance. Additional time off may be requested so making known the additional FMLA and stimulus for those on furlough due to COVID concerns. Courthouse still by appointment only and only for essential services, most department expanding their capabilities digitally and other alternate options to continue to meet the needs of the public. Will continue to monitor statistical data as well as making know COVID testing locations to the public. Standard of maintaining 10 or less in the bldg. if at all possible, along with signing in any visitors to the bldg. by the Security Guard for tracking purposes. Travis Beesley continues to disburse PPE as needed. Reference to the Tulsa World article Gov Stitt indicating numbers declining. Final words of encouragement that the County Officials have all joined forces to do a great job during the crisis and will continue to rise to the occasion as needed.

AGENDA #6-A motion was made by Commissioner Martin and seconded by Commissioner Kirk to approve and to discuss the Federal CARES Act funding along with update by Emergency Management Director Travis Beesley and County Clerk's Second Deputy Dena Tolle. The first approved application has been submitted and approved along with a successful Risk Assessment. Accounts confirmed the first reimbursement should arrive in the next couple weeks. A second financial request will be submitted within the next week for ongoing PPE expenses and Personnel directly related to Public Safety and Security. Commissioner Martin had some clarifying questions regarding the requirements of the funds as well as the disbursements when they are received. The CARES Act help team has confirmed that the funds may be put back into the budget and disbursed as needed since they are reimbursing these expenses that are COVID related, so no special stipulations.

AGENDA #7-A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Martin to approve request by jail administrator, Murray Gross, to purchase 50 jail mats at the estimated cost of \$2,407.50 which is an ongoing replacement item approximately every 2 – 3 years due to normal wear and tear and flooding confirmed by Sheriff Harlan Moore.
