AGENDA #3- No action was taken on the item to file all monthly reports submitted by officers as there were none.

AGENDA #4- A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Kirk to approve payment of an invoice from Tulsa County Juvenile Bureau in the amount of \$341.25. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #5- A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter to approve payment to Craig County Sheriff for housing inmates in the amount of \$7,614. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #6- A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter to approve discussion and action on courthouse door security, including disabling of alarms. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Secretary Kathy Parker said a member of the sheriff's department alerted the County Clerk that people were using all the doors in the courthouse to enter and exit. There is one door for public entry and exit. The others are equipped with alarms. The alarms can be disabled, and employees in the offices near the doors said they had seen individuals turn off the alarms. The alarms are battery operated.

"Who is turning off the alarms? Did they say?" Assessor Lorena Ellis-Cook asked.

"Attorneys," Parker said.

Undersheriff Tracy Shaw suggested installing crash bars, such as schools use. That way there would be no worry with batteries or disabling the alarms.

"We need to look into something more secure," Poindexter said. Shaw agreed to shop for crash bars.

AGENDA #7- A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter to open a quarterly meeting with all elected officials as recommended by the State Auditor and Inspector's Office to address county-wide controls. The 6 elected officials present discussed the need to meet each quarter to establish an effective system of internal controls including ethical tone; policies and procedures that are in place, understood and followed; and a county-wide commitment to implement strong internal controls and effective risk management.

Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

The commissioners skipped to item #16 to allow the sheriff and undersheriff to return to work.

AGENDA #16- A motion was made by Commissioner Poindexter and seconded by Commissioner Kirk to approve discussion with possible action concerning medical services for the jail.

Sheriff Harlan Moore said Joe Gelinas will cease work as the county's medical provider June 30.

Shaw presented three proposals for medical services at the jail.

"The first is Turn Key, just like we had before for \$76,000," Shaw said.

"So nearly \$30,000 more than before," Kirk said.

"Dr. Cox will take over with the same nurse for \$5,500 a month; \$66,000 a year." Shaw said.

"A doctor named Parrish at Sam Hider will take it for \$1,040 a month without medical practice insurance, if we add the cost of that, it will be \$48,500 a year," Shaw said.

"Didn't we have some problem with them, getting medicine or something?" Kirk asked.

"You mean Sam Hider?" Moore said. "We always have trouble with them."

Kirk asked why Gelinas was leaving.

"He didn't want to do it last year," Shaw said.

"I think his practice was just getting so big that he didn't have time," Moore said. "Not a lot of people want to do this job. Tracy has worked hard to get you three options."

Poindexter said the District Attorney would have to approve the choice first. He asked Moore which option he preferred. Moore said he would like to hire Cox to do the job.

Shaw will take the contract to the D. A. for approval and if it is approved, the commissioners will approve the choice at the next meeting.

AGENDA #19 – A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter to approve the renewal of leases for equipment acquired through the County Road Machinery and Equipment Revolving Fund, and verify insurance for fiscal year 2019-2020. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

AGENDA #20- A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter to open the floor for any new business. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

Parker told the commissioners she got an Initial Damage Assessment Sheet from Oklahoma Department of Transportation Specialist Bruce Martin at the Circuit Engineering District meeting. She said Martin suggests all damage be recorded, whether it is an ODOT-approved road or not, as the information can be used for FEMA qualification. Parker said she would like to document the damage and take pictures because the information will be needed to complete the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards (SEFA) report which is required each fiscal year. She asked for locations to visit to document the recent and on-going damage.

AGENDA #21-A motion was made by Commissioner Kirk and seconded by Commissioner Poindexter to open the floor for citizen's participation or public comments. Roll call: Commissioner Poindexter-yes, Commissioner Kirk-yes. Motion carried.

Mike Major asked what the "functional aspects of FEMA" are, as he is trying to get the Federal Emergency Management Agency to repair his road. "Where can I review that list?" Major said. "I understand they only pay 80 percent."

Poindexter said it is correct that FEMA pays for 80 percent of fixing damage.

"We go through Robert Real," Poindexter said. "They never send the same people twice." Poindexter told Major individuals do not get the road approved for funds. First a damage threshold must be met by the commissioners submitting the damage, then FEMA will make the determination concerning funds and which projects will get funded.

"So I need to talk to Russell?" Major said. Poindexter told him that is the first step.
